Project Street Dogs Thailand Foundation

This is our projects new initiative; the first newsletter! Through this newsletter we will explain the purpose of our foundation. In the following letters we will keep you informed about the welfare of the street dogs and cats and about the daily efforts and results of our volunteers.

We started to take care of street dogs and cats in 2011 at one temple in Hua Hin Thailand. By now we have expanded our area of work throughout Hua Hin. Sick and severely wounded animals from other places and regions are also brought to us regularly.

Marlie Timmermans, founder of this foundation:

"Our goal is to reduce the street dogs and cats population in Hua Hin by sterilizing them and to relieve them from pain, itching and hunger."

If possible we look for new homes for puppies and adult dogs and cats in Thailand and abroad. Many people assume we have a shelter, which is not the case. We are a small team that takes care of hundreds of street dogs on a daily basis. With the help of the local vets animals are being sterilized and receive necessary medical care.



Facts and figures 2016:

In 2016 we have had the local vet treated over 200 sick and injured street dogs and cats.

Dozens of sterilizations as well as amputations took place. Infections and diseases like cancer were fought. The street dogs and cats also received the necessary vaccinations. We also vaccinated a lot of animals at the temple and on the streets.

We found a lot of puppies on the streets, many of which have been adopted.

In the meantime 55 street dogs and puppies were adopted in 8 countries other than Thailand; in the Netherlands, the USA, Austria, Norway, Scotland, the UK, Canada en Finland. They are now called rescue dogs!

Since the start of our project in 2011, we have seen an increase of Thai people that offer help to the street dogs and cats. They do not turn away when they see sick or injured animals. They seek our help, work with us and in this way contribute to the welfare of the street dogs and cats. It is nice to see these people are trying to find supporters among the Thai population and make them aware of the suffering. They search for new homes for street dogs and cats and try to solicit donations in various ways. We experience this necessary development as very positive!
